Work Party

The workday, March 20 was a success. Not as many members showed up to help as in the past but quite a lot was accomplished. The trailer floor was repaired, the roofs over the pistol and rifle range were fixed, trees and brush were cut, trash raked up and disposed of, pins moved to the basement, shelves added to the steel target bin, and numerous other jobs completed. A big thanks to all who helped.

Pin Match Notes:

On March 14, we had 21 pin shooters. This is the best turnout we have had for a while, but it takes longer to finish. It will help speed up the match if everyone who is

not coming to the line to shoot, or picking up brass from just shooting would help set the pins. When setting pins, it works best if the best ones are put on the bottom so they have a better chance of rolling off. Any split or very heavy lumpy pins should be discarded and replaced with good ones.

When called to the line to shoot, take your place from left to right in the order your name was called, bring your empty gun in a case, bag, or holster and do not handle it until the line is called hot, then load and be ready when it is your turn to shoot. The line remains "hot" while other shooters are shooting, so get loaded and ready for your turn, being careful to always keep the muzzle pointed down range. If you need to refill magazines, it might help to get someone to load them for you while you are shooting. It will also speed things up if you help with timing. When using the timer, especially with .22's, be sure to point the microphone at the muzzle of the shooter's gun so

the shots are recorded. If you are not shooting, timing, coaching, or loading magazines for someone, if you would stay back from the line it would help make the line visible to the RO, and keep a path open for the score keeper to move to record the times. If the number of shooters increases, we may want to go back to a 10:00 shoot, and a 12:30 shoot. Please let us know if the afternoon works better for you.
