WELCOME TO THE LLR&P CLUB. WE ARE HAPPY TO HAVE YOU
JOIN OUR MERRY LITTLE BAND. THIS LETTER IS TO GIVE YOU
SOME BACKGROUND OF WHERE WE CAME FROM, WHAT WE DO, AND AN
IDEA OF OUR GOALS FOR THE FUTURE.

ORIGINALLY THE CLUB WAS CALLED THE GRANVILLE RIFLE
CLUB. IT WAS FORMED BY TUG FRYMAN A SMALL BORE RIFLE
SHOOTER WHO LIVED IN GRANVILLE. HE AND A HAND FULL OF
OTHER SMALL BORE RIFLE SHOOTERS BUILT A 50 FOOT INDOOR
SHOOTING RANGE UNDER THE GREGORY HARDWARE STORE. THIS WAS
DONE AFTER THE WAR IN 1947. THE STORE WAS LOCATED AT 208
EAST BROADWAY IN GRANVILLE OHIO ON THE CORNER OF MAIN AND
???? . IN 1967 THE HARDWARE STORE WAS TORN DOWN AND
A LARGE GAS STATION BUILT IN IT'S PLACE. THAT IS GONE NOW
AND AN OFFICE BUILDING AND STORE FRONTS STAND IN IT'S
PLACE.

THE EARLYIST RECORDS I CAN FIND IN THE CLUB ARCHIVES
IS DATED JANUARY 9 1947. IT IS A LIST OF MATTERIAL TUG
BOUGHT AND PAID FOR TO BUILD THE RANGE. THE PROJECT COST
THE HUGE SOME OF \$72.49. I REPLICATE THE ENTIRE LIST AS
THE 1947 COSTS ARE NOTE WORTHY.

THAT IS WHAT IT COST TO GET US STARTED. TUG PAID THIS OUT
OF HIS OWN POCKET. THOSE OF US WHO KNEW HIM COULD SAFLY
SAY TUG WAS A VERY FRUGAL MAN. SO HE REALY MUST HAVE
WANTED A PLACE TO SHOOT. HOWEVER I BELEIVE HE WAS
EVENTULLY REIMBURED BY THE CLUB BECAUSE THE NEXT PAGE LIST
THE INITIAL MEMBERS AND THE DUES. THERE WAS A MEMBERSHIP
FEE OF \$10.00 PLUS ANNIAL DUES OF \$6.00. THATS .50 CENTS A
MONTH. WHISH WE COULD DO THAT TODAY. THE DUES WERE PRO
RATED IF YOU JOINED LATE IN THE YEAR.

THE FIRST 10 MEMBERS WERE:

JOHN EVERETT, ROSS JONES, TIM MILEY, LYN ATWELL, BOB THOMPSON, BYRON HAANAS?, HENERY KLOTZ, VIGIL (TUG) FRYMAN, WALTER CURTISS (NO RELATION TO YOUR WRITER), JOHN WATINS, CHARLES WILLIAMS, AND PETE BOGGS.

BY JANUARY 1948 THEY HAD SPENT AN ADDITIONAL \$167.06 ON TARGETS AND AMMO. 1000 22LR SHELLS COST \$8.40 BOUGHT FROM CRANE KRIEG & FLORY HARDWARE IN NEWARK. (THE LOCAL WINCHESTER DISTRIBUTER FOR CENTRAL OHIO)

THEY HAD A JUNIOR DIVISION AND JOINED THE CENTRALOHIO RIFLE LEAUGE FROM THE START. IN JUNE 1947 THEY BOUGHT A RIFLE FOR THE JUNIORS FROM MEMBER TIM MILEY FOR \$11.00. I BELIVE THIS IS THE MOSSBERG M43S WE STILL HAVE. SINCE THIS MODEL WAS DISCONTINUED IN 1937 IT MUST HAVE BEEN USED WHEN WE GOT IT.

1953 THE CLUB BOUGHT 2 MORE MOSSBERG RIFLES FROM SMITH BROTHERS HARDWARE FOR \$50.80. THAT WAS FOR BOTH RIFLES. WE STILL HAVE THEM. SMITH BROTHERS WAS A WHOLESALE HARDWARE DISTRIBUTOR IN COLUMBUS. THE BUILDING IS NOW ABANDON AND IS BEING CONSIDERED FOR RENOVATION INTO UPSCALE APARTMENTS AS IT HAS A COMMANDING VIEW OF GREATER COLUMBUS. IT IS DOWNTOWN A FEW BLOCKS NORTH OF BROAD STREET.

1954 THE PISTOL SHOOTERS IN NEWARK JOINED TUG'S RIFLEMEN IN GRANVILLE. THE FOLLOWING IS A SHORT DIGRESSION OF THEIR HISTORY AND WHY THE MOVED.

AFTER WWII RALPH DONALSON AND ED FUNK OF NEWARK WERE SHOOTING PISTOL IN THE OLD NEWARK FIRE STATION AT SHIELDS AND MOUNT VERNON ROAD. I BELEIVE IT IS CURRENTLY A BAKERY. THAT BUILDING WAS SOLD BY THE CITY AND THEY WERE PUT OUT AS THEY DID NOT HAVE A LEASE. THEY MOVED TO THE OLD NEWARK YMCA WHICH STILL STANDS AT THE CORNER OF CHURCH AND 3RD STREETS IN NEWARK. THAT RANGE WAS UNDER THE CHURCH STREET SIDE WALK AND WAS ORIGINALLY A 1 LANE BOWLING ALLY. THE YMCA SHOOTING PROGRAME WAS HEADED UP BY RALPH (SMITTY) SMITH.

WHEN THE NEW YMCA WAS BUILT IN 1954 AN INDOOR SHOOTING RANGE WAS PLANNED BUT NEVER INCORPORATED IN THE FINAL DESIGN SO THE NEWARK PISTOL SHOOTERS WERE PUT OUT AGAIN AND MOVED IN WITH TUG FRIMANS' GOURP IN GRANVILLE. THE CLUB WAS STILL CALLED THE GRANVILLE RIFLE CLUB AT HWHAT TIME. IT STAYED THERE UNTIL THE HARDWARE STORE WAS TORN DOWN IN 1967.

IN 1954 RALPH DONALSON'S NAME FIRST APPEARS IN THE CLUB RECORDS. HE WAS REIBURSED FOR PURCHSING PISTOL TARGETS. OTHER EXPENSES THAT YEAR INCLUDED \$36.05 FOR A USED TV FOR THE CLUB ROOM. ALSO A TOILET WAS INSTALLED FOR \$22.50. I THINK THIS WAS FOR THE TOILET AND THE PLUMBER. TRY GETTING THAT PRICE TODAY. THEY DID SPEND \$11.80 FOR LUMBER SO THE TOILET WOULD BE SOME WHAT PRIVATE, BUT STILL A BARGAIN BY TODAYS STANDARDS. A TV ANTTENA WAS INSTALLE FOR \$5.00. THE LARGE WOOD CABINET THAT IS NOW (YEAR 2002) IN THE OFFICE AT DILLON WAS PURCHASED FOR \$30.00 FROM ALBERT COURTNEY.

DENISON'S ROTC SHOWS UP ON THE BOOKS FOR THE FIRST TIME. THEY PAID \$28.88 WHICH WAS RENT FOR THE RANGE FROM JANUARY TO MAY. THIS WAS SO OUR FUTURE MILITARY OFFICERS COULD LEARN TO SHOOT. I KNOW THEY STORED THEIR GOVERNMENT ISSUE 22 RIFLES IN THE SIDE ROOM.

1957 ACCORDIAN TO THE MINUTES OF THE NOVEMBER 8 MEETING IT WAS DECIDED TO AFFILIATE WITH THE NRA. THE CLUB BY LAWS WERE TO BE DRAFTED BY THE SECRETARY SO THE NRA AFFILIATION COULD PROCEED. AT THIS MEETING THE FIRST SUGGESTION OF INCORPORATING THE CLUB WAS BROUGHT UP. IT WAS DECIDED TO STUDY THE MATTER FURTHER. IT WAS ALSO DECIDED THAT THE RIFLE AND PISTOL CLUBS WHILE COMING TOGETHER AS ONE GROUP THEY SHOULD HAVE SEPARATE OFFICERS WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE PRESIDENT. TUG FRIMAN WAS VOTED PRESIDENT, C YOUNG VP RIFLE, G STAGG VP PISTOL, JOINT SEC TREASURER J MILLER, ED FUNK ASSISTANT SEC TREASURER PISTOL, RANGE OFFICERS R DONALSON PISTOL AND P GOODRIDGE RIFLE, INSTRUCTORS B SELBY RIFLE AND J CONLON PISTOL.

1958 NOT MUCH HAPPENED THAT YEAR.

1959 THE CLUB WAS INCORPORATED MARCH 31, 1959. THIS WAS A BIG MOVE FOR OUR LITTLE ORGANIZATION. DICK HAMANN HANDLED MOST OF THE PAPER WORK. THE ATTORNEYS WERE MORROE GORDON AND BIRD OF WHICH E CLARK MORROW WAS THE STATUARY AGENT. THEIR OFFICES ARE STILL THE LAWYERS OF RECORD.

1960 THE DENNISON COLLEGE ROTC MOVED OUT TO THEIR OWN RANGE. WE HAD TO PAY ALL THE UTILITY BILLS FROM NOW ON. THE ELECTION OF OFFICERS WAS HELD DURING THE LAST BUSINESS MEETING FOR 1960. THE RESULTS WERE T FRYMAN PRESIDENT (GOING BACK IN) TAKING OVER FROM JOHN MILLER, B SELBY VP, J CONLON KEPT AS SECRETAY, PAUL MOUNTJOY TREASUER, J MILLER TOOK OVER AS EXECUTIVE OFFICER FOR THE RIFLE CLUB AND RALPH SMITH FOR THE PISTOL CLUB, THE INSTRUCTORS WERE J MILLER RIFLE AND J CONLON PISTOL. RALPH DONALSON OFFERED THE USE OF SOME OF THE GROUND AT HIS FARM FOR AN OUT DOOR RIFLE RANGE. (HISTORICAL NOTE: HIS FARM WAS ALL SHOOTING RANGE WHICH HE VERY GENEROUSLY LET ANY ONE USE WITH OUT CHARGE. HE ENJOYED SHOOTING AND WAS VERY VERY GENEROUS IN SUPPORTING THE SHOOTING SPORT. OWENS CORNING BUILT A TRAP RANGE ON THE HILL TOP WITH CLUB HOUSE AND EVENTUALLY CEMENT WALKS.) THE OUT DOOR RANGE WAS NOT BUILT UNTIL 1966 WHEN MEMBER DON BLACK BORROWED A BULL DOZER FROM HIS EMPLOYER YOUNG EXCUVATING AND GRADED THE SITE FOR US. THE MEMBERS THEN ERECTED A RR TIE WALL AGAINST THE DIRT PILE. THE REMAINS OF THIS 50 YARD RANGE CAN STILL BE SEEN (YEAR 2002) FROM THE WELSH HILLS ROAD AT THE TOP OF THE HILL AFTER PASSING THE WELSH BAPTIS HILLS CHURCH WHEN DRIVING NORTH. LOOK BEYOND THE LITTLE FARM HOUSE ON THE RIGHT. THIS WHOLE 68 ACRE PROPERTY WAS A SHOOTING RANGE.

1961 OWENS CORNING RENTED THE RANGE TO TRAIN SECURITY GUARDS. THIS LASTED FOR A NUMBER OF YEARS AND BROUGHT THE CLUB ABOUT \$250.00 ANNUAL INCOME WHICH WAS BADLY NEEDED. THEY STAYED THROUGH 1973 AND MAY BE LONGER.

1962 - 1963 OUR LITTLE BAND DID AN EXTENSIVE REMODELING OF THE RANGE. NEW 3/8" STEEL BACK STOP PLATES WERE NEEDED BECAUSE WE WERE SHOOTING MOSTLY PISTOLS AND A LOT OF THEM WERE US GOVERNMENT DIRECTOR OF CIVILIAN MARKMENSHIP M1911 .45ACPS PISTOLS WITH WITH DCM HARD BALL

AMMO. THE SITTING ROOM WAS CLEANED UP AND A NEW WALL BETWEEN IT AND THE RANGE INSTALLED TO REDUCE THE MUZZLE BLAST NOISE. WE WERE BEGINNING TO REALIZE THE NOISE DID NOT ENHANCE OUR HEARING. A 2X4 8 FEET LONG COST .75 AND DCM 22LR AMMO WAS .51 CENTS A 50 ROUND BOX INCLUDING FREIGHT.

IN A LETTER TO JOHN CONLON DATED 5/31/1962 THE DIRECTOR OF CIVILIAN MARKSMANSHIP DISCONTINUED OUR JUNIOR AFFILIATION AS WE DID NOT HAVE 10 ACTIVE JUNIORS. THE JUNIORS THAT WERE LEFT SHOT WITH THE SENIOR RIFLE SHOOTERS UNTIL 1968 WHEN JOHN CONLON AND PETE CURTIS STARTED A NEW JUNIOR ORGANIZATION.

1964

1965 AT THE BUSINESS MEETING PRESIDENT TUG FRYMAN MADE THE ANNOUNCEMENT THAT UNION OIL MIGHT BUY THE HARDWARE STORE SOME TIME AFTER JANUARY 1 1966 FOR A GAS STATION. A COMMITTEE WAS SET UP TO LOOK FOR NEW HOME IF THIS HAPPENED.

1966 A LETTER FROM MOSSBERG GUN COMPANY TO JA CURTIS (PETE) REGARDING THE CLUB JUNIOR TARGET RIFLE M43S IS INTERESTING. THEY STATED IT WAS DISCONTINUED IN 1937 AND THEY HAD FEW PARTS LEFT AFTER 35 YEARS. HOWEVER THEY SAID SEND IT IN AND WE WILL LOOK AT IT. IF IT COULD NOT BE REPAIRED THEY WOULD ALLOW A TRADE IN ON A NEW RIFLE. AS OF THIS WRITING IN THE YEAR 2002 "HOW THINGS HAVE CHANGED". YES THE RIFLE WAS SENT IN, IT WAS REPAIRED, AND IS STILL IN CLUB SERVICE, 65 YEARS LATTER. THIS YEAR THE CLUB STARTED TO REVIVE THE JUNIOR RIFLE PROGRAM.

1967 A TRAUMATIC EVENT TOOK PLACE. THE GREGORY HARDWARE STORE WAS SOLD TO UNION OIL. IT WAS TO BE TORN DOWN AND WE HAD TO GET OUT! THE MEMBERS SCOUTED AROUND AND FOUND THE OLD CHEVROLET BODY SHOP BETWEEN 3RD AND 4TH STREETS ON CANAL STREET IN NEWARK WAS AVAILABLE. IT HAD BEEN THE FALINGHAM CHEVROLET BODY SHOP IT THE 1930S AND THE BASEMENT HAD BEEN USED AS A SHOOTING RANGE AROUND 1940 TO 1941. THE SMELTER'S CHEVROLET DEALER ALLOWED US TO MOVE IN AT NO CHARGE IF WE CLEANED AND MAINTAINED IT. THE MEMBERS HAULED AWAY SEVERAL LARGE TRUCK LOADS OF TRASH. WE WERE VERY LUCKY SINCE THIS BASEMENT HAD BEEN USED FOR A SHOOTING RANGE AND THE SAND PITS AND RR TIES WERE STILL THERE AFTER 30 YEARS ABANDONMENT. IT TOOK A LOT OF WORK BY ALL THE MEMBERS TO SECURE THE BUILDING, PUT ON A NEW STEEL DOOR, BUILD A CLUB ROOM, AND FIRING LINE. ALL THE STEEL FROM GRANVILLE WAS TRUCKED INTO NEWARK AND SET UP. AT THE OLD RANGE IN GRANVILLE BILL SHERARD AND PETE CURTIS SHOVELED UP ALL THE SCRAP 22 BRASS THAT HAD ACCUMULATED ON THE RANGE FOR 20 YEARS. SINCE THE SHOOTING LINE WAS PAVED WITH CINDERS FROM THE HARD WARE STORE BOILER WE HAD AS MUCH DIRT AS BRASS. THIS AMOUNTED TO A PICK TRUCK LOAD WHICH WE TOOK TO THE SCHONBERG JUNK YARD. THEY HAD THE BRASS SMELTED OUT OF THE CINDERS AND PAID US FIVE CENTS A POUND FOR THE RESULTING 811 POUNDS OF BRASS. WHILE THE NEW INDOOR RANGE IN DOWN TOWN NEWARK WAS BEING BUILT RALPH DONALDSON LET THE GROUP USE HIS OUTDOOR

SHOOTING RANGE ON THE WELSH HILLS ROAD FOR AN EVENING SHOOT. THIS SHOOT AND BUSINESS MEETING WAS HELD IN SEPTEMBER.

1968 IN FEBRUARY JOHN CONLON APPLIED TO THE NRA FOR APPROVAL AND REGISTRATION OF A BASIC SMALL ARMS TRAINING COURSE. WITH THEIR APPROVAL THE CLUB STARTED A NEW JUNIOR RIFLE CLUB. THE KIDS WERE RECRUITED ON THE NEWARK HIGH SCHOOL CAMPUS. THERE WERE 18 MEMBERS BY THE END OF THE YEAR. IT RAN FOR MANY YEARS AND WAS SUSTAINED BY JOHN CONLON, PETE CURTIS, AND MANY OTHER CLUB MEMBERS. THERE IS A VERY GOOD PHOTO OF JOHN AND MR MCKINNEY (ACTIVITIES DIRECTOR) OF THE HIGH SCHOOL AND 3 JUNIORS IN THE FILES.

1969 THE JUNIOR ROSTER CAME TO 21 MEMBERS THE YEAR 1969.

1970 WE SOLD 600 POUNDS OF LEAD TO SCHONBERG'S SCRAPE YARD FOR 3 1/2 CENTS A POUND. THERE WERE 20 SENIOR MEMBERS IN 1970. THE OFFICERS VOTED IN AT THE FALL BUSINESS MEETING WERE D HAMANN PRESIDENT, H LOTT VP RIFLE, B DENNIS VP PISTOL, J CONLON SECRETARY, D OBERHOLTZER TREASURER, BETWEEN 1969 AND 1975 THINGS WERE PRETTY ROUTINE. THE BUILDING MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENTS WERE ON GOING. WE CONTINUALLY TRIED TO BALANCE LIMITED INCOME WITH A LARGE OUT GO OF FUNDS. FINALLY THE DUES WERE RAISED TO \$15.00.

1976 THE PEOPLE AT THE GARAGE WERE LEAVING THE UPSTAIRS DOOR OPEN AND WE WERE HEATING THE GREAT OUTDOORS. WE OWED THE GAS COMPANY \$393.76 DOLLARS IN MARCH OF 1976. THE GAS COMPANY LOVED US. THIS DISPUTE COULD NOT BE RESOLVED WITH THE CHEVY DEALER SO WE HAD TO MOVE IMMEDIATELY TO AVOID BANKRUPTCY. WE HAD \$186.65 IN OUR CHECKING ACCOUNT THE END OF MARCH 1976. THE CLUB WAS INACTIVE FOR 8 YEARS WITH THE EQUIPMENT IN STORAGE.

1984 BOB DENNIS SENT OUT A LETTER TO THE OLD MEMBERSHIP ASKING IF ANY OF THEM WOULD BE INTERESTED IN GETTING THE CLUB GOING AGAIN. ABOUT A DOZEN REPLIED. THEN ON AUGUST 31 1984 BOB HELD A MEETING AT THE NEWARK KP HALL. EIGHTEEN MEMBERS ATTENDED. THEY WERE B DENNIS, D CALDWELL, ART CLARY, H POWERS, RICHARD POWERS, R BROWN, J BARKER, D TAYLOR, H LOTT, A BARSOTTI, A WOOD, R BALLARD, J BATES, R VELICAN, E DAVENPORT, J BELL, T JORDAN, B OLDARKER, W RYAN, AND R NYEVS. THEY TOURED THE BASEMENT AND HELD A MEETING DURING WHICH OFFICERS WERE ELECTED. THEY WERE, PRESIDENT BOB DENNIS, VICE PRESIDENT TONY BARSOTTI, AND TREASURE WAS DAVE CALDWELL. DAVE CALDWELL MADE A MOTION THE CLUB NAME SHOULD BE CHANGED TO "LAND OF LEGEND GUN CLUB". THE MINUETS DO NOT SHOW THE MOTION WAS ACTED ON. THIS WAS THE BEGINNING OF THE NAME CHANGE TO "LAND OF LEGEND RIFLE AND PISTOL CLUB".

ON DECEMBER 9TH 1984 THE CLUB HELD A MEETING AT THE DILLON SPORTSMAN AREA SHOOTING RANGE. IT IS LOCATED AT THE STATE OF OHIO DILLON RECREATIONAL PARK. THEY SHOT SOME BOWLING PINS INSIDE.?????? THE MEMBERS VOTED TO RENT THE FACILITY ONCE A MONTH FOR \$50.00 SO PIN MATCHES COULD BE HELD. THE CONTRACTOR WHO WAS OPERATING THE SHOOTING RANGE

CONCESSION FOR THE STATE AGREED AND WE WERE OFF AND RUNNING.

1985 THE STATE CONTRACTOR WHO WAS LEASING THE SHOOTING RANGE FROM THE STATE WENT BANKRUPT. THEN IN JUNE BOB DENNIS MADE AN AGREEMENT THE PARK MANAGEMENT AND THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES FOR THE CLUB TO USE THE RANGE FOR THE REST OF THE YEAR. THAT AGREEMENT GAVE US A HOME FOR THE REST OF THE WINTER OF 1985-86.

1985 THERE IS A NOTE IN THE CASH LEDGER THAT AS OF 8/31/84 THE CLUB WOULD BE KNOWN AS THE LAND OF LEGEND RIFLE AND PISTOL CLUB. HOWEVER ACCORDING TO THE MINUETS OF THE MEETING 2/10/85 THE NAME CHANGE WAS NOT VOTED IN OFFICIALLY UNTIL THIS MEETING. IT WAS ALSO VOTED THE CHARTER, NRA AFFILIATION, AND INCORPORATION BE UP DATED TO REFLECT THE NAME CHANGE.

THE DILLON PROPERTY WAS RENTED FOR \$100.00 A DAY ONE DAY PER MONTH. ART CLARY WAS ELECTED EDITOR OF THE CLUB NEWS LETTER APRIL 14, 1985.

1986 IN THE SPRING OF 1986 DAVE EMBRY BID IN THE LEASE IN THE NAME OF THE LEAGUE OF OHIO SPORTSMEN (LOOS) WHO AGREED TO SUBSIDIZE THE COST OF THE OPERATION AS A PUBLIC SERVICE. AFTER 5 YEARS DAVE HAD A HEART ATTACK AND HAD TO STOP RUNNING DILLON.

1992 DURING THE YEARS BETWEEN 1986 AND 1992 THE MEMBERSHIP GOT ORGANIZED. THEY BUILT STEEL BOWLING PIN TABLES, MADE A VARIETY OF STEEL MATCH TARGETS, AND GENERALLY GOT THINGS UP AND RUNNING.
